The Sermon On The Mount Fulfillment Matthew 5:17-20

- Matthew 5:3 "Blessed are the **poor in spirit**, **for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.**
- Luke 4:17 And the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written,
- Luke 4:18 "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed,
- Luke 4:19 to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."
- Luke 4:20 And he rolled up the scroll and gave it back to the attendant and sat down. And the eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him.
- Luke 4:21 And he began to say to them, "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."

Jesus came to set captives free, restore sight to the blind, to provide liberty to the oppressed. In order for Him to fulfill this prophecy and all the others He had to fulfill the Law, and all of it's demands.

2Corinthians 1:20 For all the promises of God find their Yes in him. That is why it is through him that we utter our Amen to God for his glory.

A few reminders:

Romans 7:12 So the law is holy, and the commandment is holy and righteous and good.

- 1Timothy 1:8 Now we know that the law is good, if one uses it lawfully,
- John 5:39 You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is they that bear witness about me,
- John 5:46 For if you believed Moses, you would believe me; for he wrote of me.

Luke 24:27 And beginning with **Moses and all the Prophets**, he interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning himself.

Luke 24:44 Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled."

Matthew 5:17 "**Do not think** that I have come to **abolish the Law** <u>or</u> **the Prophets**; I have not come to abolish them but **to fulfill them.**

Fulfillment of prophecy:

Matthew 1:21 She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

Matthew 1:22 All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet:

Matthew 2:5 for so it is written by the prophet:

Matthew 2:15 This was to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by **the prophet...**

Matthew 2:17 Then was fulfilled what was spoken by the prophet Jeremiah:

Matthew 2:23 so that what was spoken by the prophets might be fulfilled

Matthew 4:14 so that what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled:

Matthew 8:17 This was to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah...

Matthew 12:17 This was to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah...

Matthew 13:35 This was to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet...

Matthew 21:4 This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet...

Matthew 26:56 But all this has taken place that the Scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled...

Matthew 5:18 For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an **iota**, not a **dot**, will pass from **the Law until all is accomplished.**

Matthew 5:19 Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven.

Matthew 5:20 For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

Romans 10:1 Brothers, my heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved.

Romans 10:2 For I bear them witness that they have a zeal for God, **but not according to knowledge.**

Romans 10:3 For, being **ignorant of the righteousness of God**, and **seeking to establish their own**, they did not submit to God's righteousness.

Fulfillment of the Law:

Romans 10:4 For **Christ is the end of the law for righteousness** to everyone who believes.

Romans 3:19 Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are **under the law**, so that **every mouth may be stopped**, and the whole world may be held accountable to God.

Romans 3:20 For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.

Romans 3:21 But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—

Romans 3:22 the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction:

Romans 3:31 Do we then overthrow the law by this faith? By no means! On the contrary, we uphold the law.

"The law can do nothing else but reveal sin and pronounce condemnation upon the sinner, and yet we cannot get men away from it, even though we show them how

sweetly Jesus stands between them and it. They are so enamored of legal hope that they cling to it when there is nothing to cling to; they prefer Sinai to Calvary, though Sinai has nothing for them but thunders and trumpet warnings of coming judgment."

Galatians 3:6 just as Abraham "believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness"?

Galatians 3:7 Know then that it is **those of faith who are the sons of Abraham**.

Galatians 3:13a Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us...

Genesis 15:6 And he believed the LORD, and he counted it to him as righteousness.

Genesis 15:7 And he said to him, "I am the LORD who brought you out from Ur of the Chaldeans to give you this land to possess."

Genesis 15:8 But he said, "O Lord GOD, how am I to know that I shall possess it?"

Jeremiah 34:18 And the men who transgressed my covenant and did not keep the terms of the covenant that they made before me, I will make them like the calf that they cut in two and passed between its parts—

Genesis 15:9 He said to him, "Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon."

Genesis 15:10 And he brought him all these, cut them in half, and laid each half over against the other. But he did not cut the birds in half.

Genesis 15:11 And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.

Genesis 15:12 As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell on Abram. And behold, dreadful and great darkness fell upon him.

Genesis 15:17 When the sun had gone down and it was dark, behold, a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces.

- Genesis 15:18 On that day the **LORD made a covenant with Abram...**
- John 8:1 but Jesus went to the Mount of Olives.
- John 8:2 Early in the morning he came again to the temple. All the people came to him, and he sat down and taught them.
- John 8:3 The scribes and the **Pharisees** brought a **woman who had been caught in adultery**, and placing her in the midst
- Leviticus 20:10 "If a man commits adultery with the wife of his neighbor, both the adulterer and the adulteress shall surely be put to death.
- John 8:4 they said to him, "Teacher, this woman has been caught in the act of adultery.
- John 8:5 Now in **the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women**. So what do you say?"
- John 8:6 This they said to test him, that they might have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and wrote with his finger on the ground.
- John 8:7 And as they continued to ask him, he stood up and said to them, "Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone at her."
- John 8:8 And once more he bent down and wrote on the ground.
- John 8:9 But when they heard it, they went away one by one, beginning with the older ones, and **Jesus was left alone with the woman standing before him.**
- John 8:10 Jesus stood up and said to her, "Woman, where are they? **Has no one condemned you?"**
- John 8:11 She said, "No one, Lord." And Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you; go, and from now on sin no more."
- Isaiah 53:5 But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed.

1Peter 3:18 For Christ also suffered **once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous**, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit,

2Corinthians 5:21 For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

Malachi 3:6 "For I the LORD do not change; therefore you, O children of Jacob, are not consumed.

I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them.

Romans 3:26 It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that

he might be **just and the justifier**of the one who has faith in Jesus.
