

## Exodus 23:14-17 • “These Are a Shadow of the Things To Come”

Exodus 23:14-17 “Three times in the year you shall keep a feast to me. You shall keep the **Feast of Unleavened Bread**. As I commanded you, you shall eat unleavened bread for seven days at the appointed time in the month of Abib, **for in it you came out of Egypt**. None shall appear before me empty-handed. You shall keep the **Feast of Harvest**, of the **firstfruits** of your labor, of what you sow in the field. You shall keep the **Feast of Ingathering** at the end of the year, **when you gather in from the field the fruit of your labor**. Three times in the year shall all your males **appear before the Lord God**.

### **Feast of Ingathering/Tabernacles/Sukkot - September**

Leviticus 23:34 “Speak to the people of Israel, saying, On the fifteenth day of this seventh month and for seven days is the Feast of Booths to the Lord.

Leviticus 23:42 You shall dwell in booths for seven days. All native Israelites shall dwell in booths,

Leviticus 23:43 that your generations may know that I made the people of Israel dwell in booths **when I brought them out of the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God.**”

Nehemiah 8:14 And they **found it** written in the Law **that the Lord had commanded** by Moses that the people of Israel **should dwell in booths** during the feast of the seventh month,

Nehemiah 8:15 and that they should proclaim it and publish it in all their towns and in Jerusalem, “Go out to the hills and bring branches of olive, wild olive, myrtle, palm, and other leafy trees to **make booths, as it is written.**”

‘During the days of the **Second Temple**, traditions were added to embellish the **Feast of Sukkot**.

The third daily ceremony was the rite of the water libation. On the first morning of Sukkot a procession of priests went down to the pool of Siloam to bring up to the

Temple a golden container of water sufficient to last throughout the seven days of the feast. The water was brought up with great ceremony. The shofar was blown and the pilgrims who had come to Jerusalem for the feast waved their lulavs as the priests carried the water around the altar. The great Hallel (Psalms 113-118) were recited. **Then the priest on duty poured out the contents of two silver bowls: one held water and the other held wine.** This was an act of prayer and an expression of dependence upon God to pour out his blessing of rain upon the earth.

On the last or “great” day of the feast, the water libation rite reached its climax. The priests circled the altar seven times and then poured out the water with great pomp and ceremony. This was Hoshana Rabbah, the great “HOSHIANA,” (which translated is “save now”).”

John 7:1 After this Jesus went about in Galilee. He would not go about in Judea, because the Jews were **seeking to kill him.**

John 7:2 Now **the Jews’ Feast of Booths** was at hand.

John 7:8 You go up to the feast. I am not going up to this feast, **for my time has not yet fully come.”**

John 7:9 After saying this, he remained in Galilee.

John 7:10 But after his brothers had gone up to the feast, then he also went up, not publicly but in private.

John 7:14 About the **middle of the feast** Jesus went up into the temple and **began teaching.**

John 7:37 On the **last day of the feast**, the great day, **Jesus stood up and cried out, “If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink.**

John 7:38 Whoever **believes in me**, as the Scripture has said, ‘**Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.**’”

Exodus 17:6 Behold, I will stand before you there on the rock at Horeb, and you shall **strike the rock**, and **water shall come out of it**, and **the people will drink.**” And Moses did so, in the sight of the elders of Israel.

Isaiah 48:21 They did not **thirst** when he led them through the deserts; he made **water flow for them from the rock**; he split the **rock** and the **water gushed out.**

1Corinthians 10:4 and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the **Rock was Christ.**

John 19:34 But one of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and at once there came out **blood and water.**

Revelation 7:17 For the **Lamb** in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to **springs of living water**, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.”

### **Feast of Unleavened Bread/Passover/Pesach - April**

Leviticus 23:5 In the first month, on the **fourteenth day** of the month at **twilight**, is the Lord’s Passover.

Leviticus 23:6 And on the **fifteenth day** of the same month is the Feast of **Unleavened Bread** to the Lord; for seven days you shall eat unleavened bread.

1Corinthians 5:7 Cleanse out the old leaven that **you may be a new lump**, as you really are **unleavened**. For **Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed.**

Exodus 12:3 Tell all the congregation of Israel that on the tenth day of this month every man shall take a lamb according to their fathers’ houses, a lamb for a household.

Exodus 12:5 **Your lamb shall be without blemish**, a male a year old. You may take it from the sheep or from the goats,

Exodus 12:6 and you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month, when the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel **shall kill their lambs at twilight**.

Exodus 12:21 Then Moses called all the elders of Israel and said to them, “**Go and select lambs for yourselves** according to your clans, and **kill the Passover lamb**.”

Exodus 12:33 The Egyptians were **urgent** with the people **to send them out of the land in haste**. For they said, “We shall all be dead.”

Exodus 12:34 So the people took their dough **before it was leavened**, their kneading bowls being bound up in their cloaks on their shoulders.

Matthew 26:1 When Jesus had finished all these sayings, he said to his disciples,

Matthew 26:2 “You know that after **two days the Passover** is coming, and the **Son of Man will be delivered up to be crucified**.”

Matthew 26:3 Then the chief priests and the elders of the people gathered in the palace of the high priest, whose name was Caiaphas,

Matthew 26:4 and plotted together in order to **arrest Jesus by stealth and kill him**.

Matthew 26:5 But they said, “**Not during the feast, lest there be an uproar among the people**.”

Luke 19:36 And as he rode along, they spread their cloaks on the road.

Luke 19:37 As he was drawing near—already on the way down the Mount of Olives—the whole multitude of his disciples began to rejoice and praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works that they had seen,

Luke 19:38 saying, “Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!”

Luke 19:45 And he entered the temple and began to drive out those who sold,

Luke 22:1 Now the Feast of **Unleavened Bread** drew near, **which is called the Passover.**

Luke 22:19 And he took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, “**This is my body, which is given for you.** Do this in remembrance of me.”

Luke 22:20 And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, “**This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.**”

John 19:14 Now it was the day of Preparation of the Passover. It was about the sixth hour. He said to the Jews, “**Behold your King!**”

John 1:29 The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, “**Behold, the Lamb of God,** who takes away the sin of the world!

Matthew 27:45 Now from the sixth hour (noon) there was darkness over all the land **until the ninth hour (3 pm).**

Matthew 27:46 And about the **ninth hour** Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, “Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?” that is, “**My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?**”

John 19:28 After this, **Jesus, knowing that all was now finished,** said (to fulfill the Scripture), “**I thirst.**”

**“If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink.”**

John 19:29 A jar full of **sour wine** stood there, so they put a sponge full of the sour wine on a hyssop branch and held it to his mouth.

John 19:30 When **Jesus had received the sour wine**, he said, **“It is finished,”** and **he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.**

Matthew 20:22 Jesus answered, “You do not know what you are asking. **Are you able to drink the cup that I am to drink?**”

Matthew 26:39 And going a little farther he fell on his face and prayed, saying, **“My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will.”**

Matthew 27:50 And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice and yielded up his spirit.

Luke 23:45 while the **sun’s light failed**. And the **curtain of the temple was torn in two.**

Deuteronomy 16:6 but at the place that the Lord your God will choose, to make his name dwell in it, there you shall **offer the Passover sacrifice**, in the **evening at sunset**, at the time **you came out of Egypt.**

Hebrews 10:16 **“This is the covenant that I will make with them** after those days, declares the Lord: I will put my laws on their hearts, and write them on their minds,”

Hebrews 10:17 then he adds, **“I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more.”**

Hebrews 10:18 **Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin.**

Hebrews 10:19 Therefore, brothers, since we have **confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus,**

Hebrews 10:20 by the **new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh,**

Hebrews 10:21 and since we have a great priest over the house of God,

Hebrews 10:22 let us **draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith**, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.

### **Feast of Harvest/First Fruits/Weeks/Savuot - June**

Leviticus 23:15 “You shall count **seven full weeks from the day after the Sabbath**, from the day that you brought the sheaf of the wave offering.

Leviticus 23:16 **You shall count fifty days to the day after the seventh Sabbath**. Then you shall present a grain offering of new grain to the Lord.

Acts 1:3 He presented himself alive to them **after his suffering** by many proofs, appearing to them during **forty days** and speaking about the **kingdom of God**.

Acts 1:8 But **you will receive power** when the **Holy Spirit has come upon you**, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.”

John 14:16 And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another **Helper, to be with you forever**,

John 14:17 even the **Spirit of truth**, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, **for he dwells with you and will be in you**.

Acts 2:1 When the **day of Pentecost arrived**, they were all together in one place.

Acts 2:2 And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.

Acts 2:3 And divided tongues as of fire appeared **to them** and **rested on each one of them**.

Acts 2:4 And they were all **filled with the Holy Spirit** and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

Colossians 2:13 And you, who were **dead in your trespasses** and the uncircumcision of your flesh, **God made alive together with him**, having **forgiven us all our trespasses**,

Colossians 2:14 by **canceling the record of debt** that stood against us with its **legal demands**. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross.

Colossians 2:15 **He disarmed** the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him.

Colossians 2:16 **Therefore** let no one pass judgment on you in questions of food and drink, or with regard to a festival or a new moon or a Sabbath.

Colossians 2:17 **These are a shadow of the things to come, but the substance belongs to Christ.**
