#### A. The God Who Loves and Listens - Do we know Him?

Now Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law, Jethro, the priest of Midian, and he led his flock to the west side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. And the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire out of the midst of a bush. He looked, and behold, the bush was burning, yet it was not consumed. # B. A People Who Love and Listen – Are we growing toward this?

## ATTENTION: Am I distracted or am I listening?

Now as they went on their way, Jesus entered a village. And a woman named Martha welcomed Him into her house. And she had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to His teaching. But Martha was distracted with much serving. Luke 10:38-42

## PERSPECTIVE: Do I view my friends through my eyes or through God's eyes?

From now on, therefore, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we once regarded Christ according to the flesh, we regard Him thus no longer. 2 Corinthians 5:16

## PURPOSE: Do my friendships have a compelling purpose?

Take care, brothers, lest there be in any of you an evil, unbelieving heart, leading you to fall away from the living God. But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called "today," that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. Hebrews 3:12-13

#### PRACTICE: How can we grow in loving and listening to our friends?

Am I seeking to listen more and talk less? (Proverbs 10:19, 17:28; James 1:19-20)

How can I grow in listening to God and listening to people?

How can I cultivate curiosity in people?

Am I seeking to ask better questions? Am I listening to answers? (Luke 18:8; John 11:25-26)

Am I opening my heart and aiming for theirs? (John 4; 2 Corinthians 6:11)

Do I know my friends well enough that I can pray with them?
