## *OurCalling*


OurCalling's goal is to seek heart-to-heart connections with our homeless friends and make disciples on the street as we share God's love. Thanks to your generosity, we can meet our homeless neighbors' daily needs. We serve breakfast and coffee along with a hot meal at lunch. We supply essential needs such as clothing and shoes and accommodate any special requests we can. We treat each person individually and want them to know they are important and loved. We do all of this as a way of showing the love of Christ while winning the right to help them off the street.

## *West Dallas Community School*

Your gifts are truly helping transform the lives of children and families in West Dallas. West Dallas Community School is committed to caring for the whole child: their physical, spiritual, intellectual, and emotional well-being. Your generosity helps us provide them with an excellent, Christ-centered education. 82% of our graduates have gone on to pursue higher education, compared to the 5% of adults in West Dallas who hold a bachelor's degree. You are helping to break and end a cycle of generational poverty in our community.

## *Mercy Street*

Mercy Street exists to cultivate mutually transforming relationships with inner-city youth through Christian mentorship. We want to empower the next generation of Christian leaders to transform their communities. We envision community transformation by cultivating community-minded youth through three distinct programs. We share the gospel through our sports ministry, help youth grow in Christ through one-on-one mentoring, and equip them to be emerging Christian leaders through our leadership program. ## *Our Ministry Partners*

### **ADVOCATES FOR COMMUNITY**

**TRANSFORMATION** is a new model of ministry using the justice system to empower inner-city residents to fight crime on their street, while sharing with them the hope of the gospel.

**ADULT REHABILITATION MINISTRY** exists to transform chemically dependent individuals through loving, accountable relationships and a Christ-centered twelve-step process in a residential treatment program.

**BEHIND EVERY DOOR** seeks to transform poverty from the inside out through on-site programming and resource partnerships in underserved apartment communities.

**BONTON FARMS** exists to restore lives, create jobs, and ignite hope in a once forgotten and neglected neighborhood with some of the most marginalized people.

**DALLAS LEADERSHIP FOUNDATION** identifies, affirms, and develops leaders to transform community leaders in schools, prisons, and neighborhoods.

**EXODUS MINISTRIES** empowers formerly incarcerated mothers and their children to achieve a productive and fulfilling life through Jesus Christ.

**MERCY STREET** exists to be used by God to spark Christ-honoring community restoration by engaging in mutually-transforming relationships with the future leaders of West Dallas through its mentoring, sports, and leadership institute programs.

**MEN OF NEHEMIAH** is a Christian organization rebuilding the lives of men and families that have been torn apart by the vicious onslaught of poverty, homelessness, substance abuse, crime, and violence.

**OURCALLING** is a faith-based organization that leads the homeless to live a healthy and sustainable lifestyle by building lasting relationships and making disciples on the streets.

**THRIVE WOMEN'S CLINIC** empowers women in unexpected pregnancies to make informed choices by providing medical, educational, and emotional support.

**UNION GOSPEL MISSION** is a faith-based homeless shelter providing food, beds, and clothing to the homeless men, women, and children in Dallas County. The organization also offers long-term housing and discipleship programs and transitional support programs.

**VOICE OF HOPE** exists to provide children living in the neighborhoods of West Dallas with strong character models, education support, life skills, and family support services needed to become productive Christian citizens.

**WEST DALLAS COMMUNITY SCHOOL** provides a private, classical, Christian education (pre-K through eighth grade) to one of the most historically underserved communities in Dallas.

**YOUNGLIFE WEST DALLAS** shares God's love with youth through caring for kids, weekly outreach club, summer camp, and Bible studies.
