



Rescued: week 4 homework

Here some situations and questions for your reflection this week (choose at least 2 to consider). Journal your answers honestly, and ask the Lord to teach you.

What fears or hang-ups do I have in my life that hinders me from sharing the gospel with others?

How good are my listening skills? What might I need to learn or improve?

Consider two individuals: A child brought up in a Christian household (say at PCPC) and an adult who is lost in a life of 'sin' (evil behavior). Both need to be saved, both need to be 'converted', both need a redemptive relationship with Christ. How would I share the gospel of Jesus Christ to both of these individuals? How would I know true 'conversion' has taken place? And how long do I think it would take for him/her to become a 'true Christian'?

What are 'points of relevance' in my life I might use to share the gospel with someone? (List them, think them through...why they are relevant, what you would say, how you would say it, when you would say it....)



Who do I know from a different culture that is not a believer in Jesus? How might I go about witnessing to her? (What will I do first, what other things, then might I do/say....?)

How might I approach sharing the gospel of Jesus to a Buddhist who understands John 3:16 as...?

“For God so loved the world that he (even) gave his only son (to get it). Anyone who (is gullible enough to) believe in Him shall not perish (enter Nirvana) but will go on being reincarnated forever and ever.”

How would I approach sharing the gospel of Jesus to a Muslim who has been taught that the Bible is corrupted and not trustworthy?

What questions do I still have about ‘conversion’ and sharing the gospel with someone who is different from me and has a different worldview? How will I get those questions answered?
